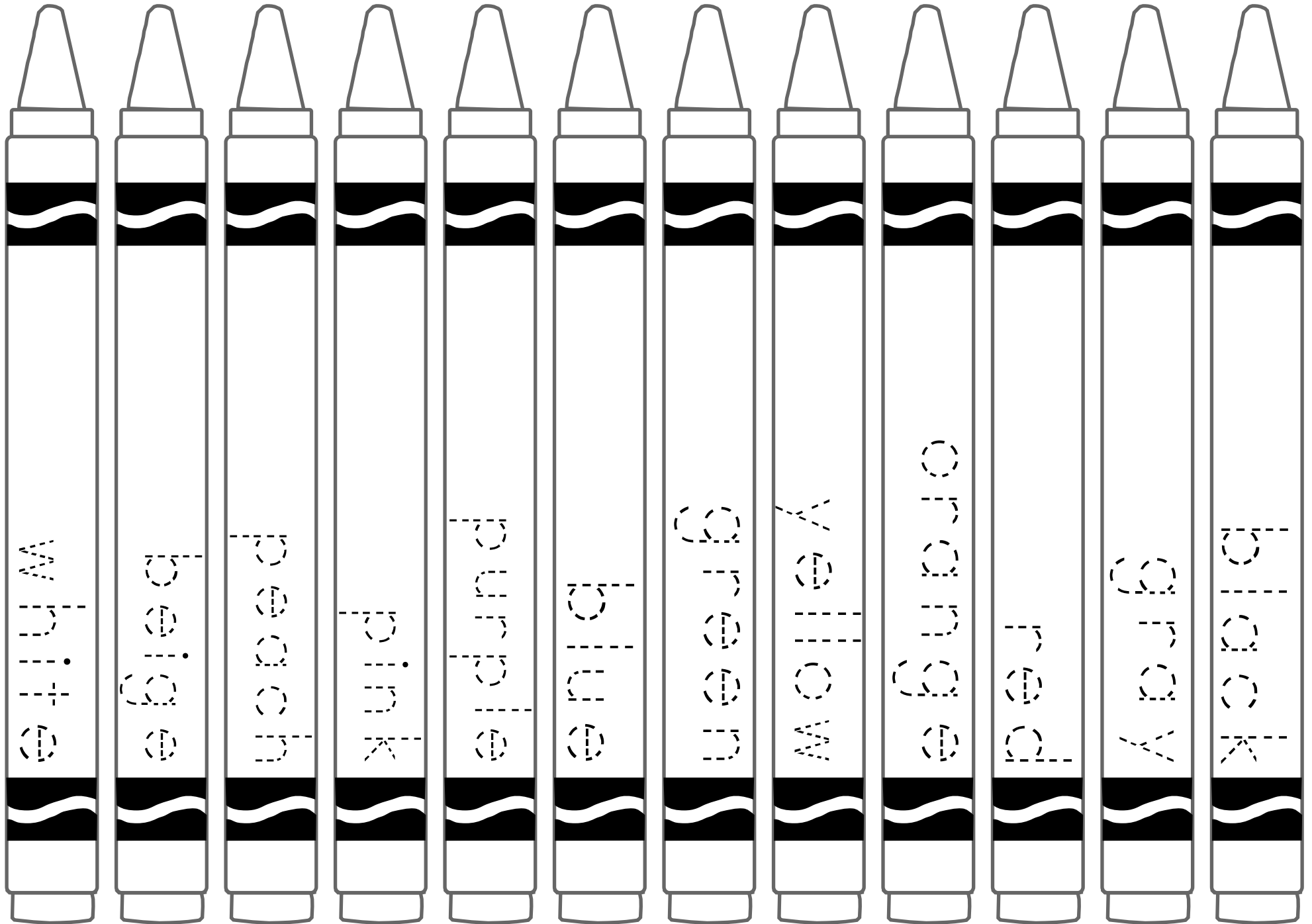


COLOR LOST AND FOUND

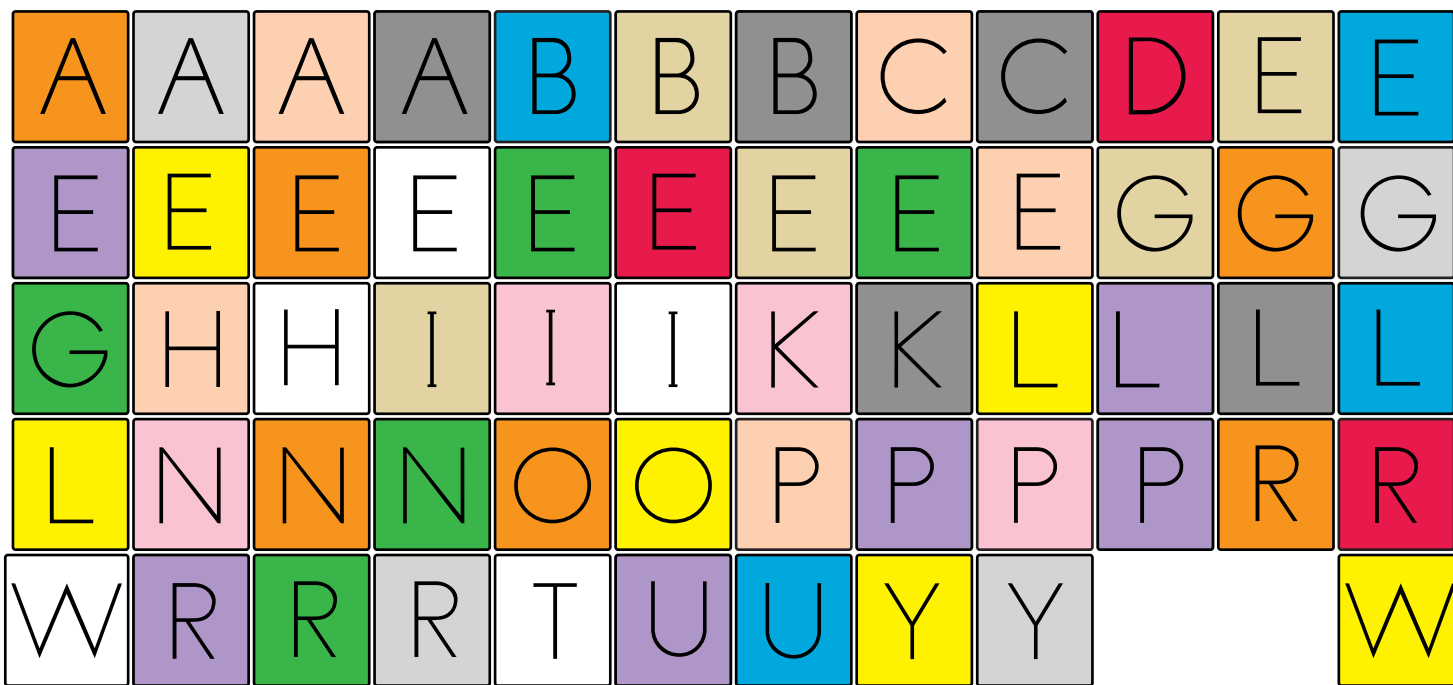


These crayons lost their colors! Can you help them get them back? For each crayon: Find a marker in the color and trace the color word. Then color each crayon with the correct colored crayon.

COLOR UNSCRAMBLE

This worksheet contains 12 identical crayon templates arranged vertically. Each crayon is oriented horizontally with the tip pointing to the left. The body of each crayon is divided into three main sections: a left section with a wavy black and white pattern, a central section divided into 10 small rectangular boxes for writing, and a right section with a wavy black and white pattern. The boxes in the central section are currently empty.

Cut out the letters below. Then **group** the letters by their color. Choose one color group to begin with. The letters in that group are the letters needed to spell the name of it's color. **Unscramble** the letters to correctly spell the color. Sounding out the color will help. **Count**, how many letters does your color have? Find a crayon on the page "Color Unscramble" with that same number of blank spots. **Color** the crayon the same color as your color word, and **glue** the letters of your unscrambled color word onto it. Continue with another color group until finished.
